### EDUCATORS

#### 1. Contextualising learning

A series of short video clips that discuss why Vocational Pathways matter, and show some examples of differing practice.

#### 2. Standards and qualifications mapping

These spreadsheets show all the assessment standards and qualifications that are mapped to the Vocational Pathways.

#### 3. Curriculum Guidance

The guidance material helps educators to develop Pathways programmes. The resources outline key ideas about Vocational Pathways; possible delivery approaches, development of relevant competencies, and provides examples of practice and learning contexts. The tool supports educators to review current programmes they are offering and formulate next steps.

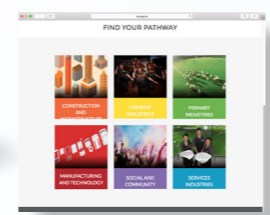
#### 6. Self-review cycle

### EDUCATORS & STUDENTS/FAMILY

#### 1. Profile builder

The profile builder is a tool on the Youth Guarantee website that helps students to explore their study options. Students can see where they are heading and think about where they would like to go by inputting the achievement standards they are currently doing or might like to do.

The tool can also be used to support educators when planning Vocational Pathways programmes and working with students to explore their study options.

#### 2. Family/whānau flyer

The flyer provides a brief introduction to Vocational Pathways for communities.

#### 3. Vocational Pathways for employers

The quick guide for employers outlines Vocational Pathways and what it means when students talk about their Vocational Profile.

#### 4. Occupation outlook

The [MBIE tool](#) supports people to make informed choices about their career pathways, by providing up to date information about the income, employment possibilities and cost of fees to train for a variety of jobs within each Pathway.

#### 5. NZQA Vocational Profile and Award

In a student's record of achievement on the NZQA website, students can see their progress towards NCEA Level 2 and a Vocational Pathways Award.

#### 6. FindMyPath

[FindMyPath](#) tool helps young people make informed choices about their study and employment pathways.

This information provides guidance on what skills employers look for, how to display these skills and be more work ready.
